



# Immunization Requirements

New York State law requires certain immunizations for college and post-secondary students. In order to attend classes, students must provide proof of immunity against measles, mumps, and rubella. *All students must comply with this law, unless medically or religiously contraindicated.* Students born prior to January 1, 1957, must submit proof of age to be exempt from these requirements. This information must be received prior to registration.

*In order to comply with the New York State Immunization Law, you must fulfill one of the three numbered requirements.*

## 1. Doses of Live Virus Vaccine

- a. Measles: two (2) doses at least 28 days apart, which must be given no more than 4 days prior to the first birthday and after 1967
- Mumps: one (1) dose after 1968
- Rubella: one (1) dose after 1968

**or**

- b. MMR: two (2) doses at least 28 days apart, which must be given no more than 4 days prior to the first birthday and after 1971

**or**

- c. MMR: one (1) dose after the first birthday and after 1971
- Measles: one (1) dose after the first birthday and after 1967

## 2. Documentation of Medically-Diagnosed Disease

This applies to measles and mumps only, not to rubella. Only serologic evidence of immunity (titer) or proof of vaccinations are acceptable.

## 3. Serologic Evidence of Immunity for Each Disease

Laboratory reports verifying immunity to measles, mumps, and rubella are required.
